Bowen family systems theory describes emotional patterns of functioning in the family that contribute to the development of physical, psychiatric, and social symptoms. Every chronic illness includes an emotional process that operates in both the family and in the person who develops the illness. The emerging field of social genomics has begun to identify how social relationships and genes interact to shape susceptibility to disease. For most of us, our family is

Speakers

Dr. Michael E. Kerr is a family psychiatrist who has studied the possible influence of the family in the creation and course of cancer and other chronic illnesses throughout his career. Dr. Kerr was a close colleague of Dr. Bowen and succeeded him as Director of the Georgetown Family Center in Washington, DC. He is co-author with Dr. Bowen of the book *Family Evaluation* and is writing another book entitled *The Hidden Life of Families*. He is currently director of the Bowen Theory Academy.

Dr. Steve Cole is a Professor of Medicine and Psychiatry and Biobehavioral Sciences in the UCLA School of Medicine. His research maps the biological pathways by which social environments influence gene expression, including genes that affect replication of viruses like HIV, the response of

the most influential set of relationships we have, both as children and as adults. This conference will explore how emotional process in the family can interact with the expression of certain genes in members of the family that affect our behaviour and our health. In addition, the conference will examine the possibility that modifying patterns of family interaction may alter the expression of genes linked to health and illness.
