NOTE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

This year at our Spring Conference, Dr. Kathleen Smith challenged us to reflect on the people or things in our lives we've stopped being curious about. It was a timely invitation to reflect on. After more than 52 years of existence, Living Systems offers countless opportunities to remain curious—about our past, our present, and our future. I am continually grateful for those who built the foundation of this organization and for those who now help sustain and grow its mission.

Over the past year, we've seen exciting developments, many born from this spirit of curiosity. Our clinical program now operates across three office spaces, two of which are staffed full-time. Together, we served over 300 clients this year. We continue to run three robust training programs, with 18 trainees and residents set to complete them this June. It's always inspiring to see how curiosity around Bowen Theory blossoms among our trainees at this time of year. We've had another successful round of Family of Origin trainings, and our new Introduction to Bowen Theory course has already run twice. Tuesday night clinical meetings remain a cornerstone, bringing together faculty, contractors, and network experts to share insights and research, we have over 30 people at most meetings. One of our most exciting new initiatives has been the Elevator Systems podcast, which has brought Bowen Theory to new audiences around the world and sparked valuable collaborations. With two seasons completed and more in the works, the new video content has helped expand our reach through social media.

April's conference, which focused on the use of Bowen Theory in clinical work, drew a large and engaged audience. And to top off the year, we launched a brand-new website, further enhancing how we connect with our community. Of course, this year also brought challenges. We've experienced a decline in client numbers for some of our counsellors, a few trainees were unable to complete their programs, and we continue to navigate the ongoing question of how best to deliver our offerings. We remain committed to finding the most effective ways to connect with people and share what we do. Our mission continues to ground us: to make knowledge of human behavior from a natural systems perspective available to the community through counseling, training, education, and research. I am so thankful for the dedicated faculty, contractors, board members, and volunteers who work tirelessly toward this goal.

Looking ahead, we have an exciting year planned. In October 2025, we'll host our first hybrid conference since the pandemic on the topic of aging at a beautiful location. In November, at the Bowen Center Symposium, we'll officially launch the 4th International Conference on Bowen Theory, which will take place in Vancouver in the summer of 2027. We're also preparing for another vibrant year of training and educational programs designed to inspire curiosity and deepen our work.

Whether it's through reading our blog, listening to the podcast, engaging in conversation at our conference, or participating in a program, we look forward to engaging with you. Writing this letter gives me a chance to reflect on how deeply our mission is being lived out and to express gratitude to the many people who make it all possible. While I can't name everyone, I want to thank all of you who contribute through teaching, supervising, learning, funding, listening, and challenging us to grow. I would like to specifically thank Mark Smith and the board for their guidance, and Leila Howard, who brings knowledge of our history and a strong commitment to our future. 

In the 2024-2025 fiscal year, with contractors, interns, residents and volunteers across multiple locations, Living Systems supported hundreds of individuals, couples and families in the Lower Mainland.



Living Systems works with individuals, couples, and families to address a wide variety of concerns such as:

- Depression, Anxiety, and Stress
- Marital issues, separation, divorce, parenting, or relationship problems
- Addictions
- Low self-esteem, assertiveness, anger, communication or career issues
- Grief, aging or health issues
- Spiritual or religious concerns

Living Systems uses a sliding fee scale to provide affordable counselling based on a client's gross income, number of dependents, and current circumstances. Services are provided by licensed therapists as well as interns and residents who are part of our clinical training program.



TRAINING & EDUCATION

Living Systems provides various programs to professionals and the public to educate individuals on the concepts and application of Bowen family systems theory. Living Systems also hosts an annual conference to bring leading researchers from various disciplines to Vancouver to explore Bowen family systems theory and other fields of study.

TRAINING PROGRAMS

CLINICAL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Instructors: Katherine White, Leila Howard, Jennifer Hassard and Lois Walker

This program is designed to provide a thorough introduction to Bowen family systems theory and therapy and contributes to students becoming competent relationship, family, and clinical counsellors, school counsellors, pastoral counsellors and social workers.

ADVANCED STUDIES PROGRAM

Instructors: Katherine White and David Galloway

The Advanced Studies program deepens the understanding of Bowen Theory and allows participants to gain further clarity in defining the concepts of Bowen Theory and their practical application.

CONTINUNING STUDIES PROGRAM

Instructors: Pamela Richmond and David Galloway

The Continuing Studies program ran for a second year in 2024/25, this time with 8 participants who gathered monthly to discuss ideas about human development. This involved exploring contributions from neurobiology to anthropology, and holding these ideas up to how development is conceptualized in BFST. Participants prepared and presented beliefs papers at the midterm and final papers which they presented to the wider Living Systems community. As the year came to an end participants were asked for feedback regarding a focus for next year. There was a resounding interest in bringing theory to clinical practice, and to answer this call the theme for next year will be Triangles. Participants will engage in a deep exploration of dynamic triangles that they experience in their families and clinical practice, coupled with reading from Dr. Bowen, the wider Bowen community, and scientific literature that discusses the significance of the triangle as core relational process.



Over this past year it has been immensely valuable to me to be able to think with the group as we grappled with ideas forged outside of the Bowen cannon and then brought these ideas back to BFST for contrast and consideration. This meeting of minds and alternative views has made an important contribution to my clinical practice and my ongoing engagement with Bowen Theory.

EDUCATION PROGRAMS



FAMILY OF ORIGIN WORKSHOP Instructor: Leila Howard

This introductory family of origin workshop is for people motivated to develop and use their family diagram as part of the process of differentiation of self.

INTRODUCTION TO BOWEN THEORY Instructor: Maybo Lui

This is a new six-week Lunch & Learn series exploring the core concepts of Bowen Family Systems Theory, and is scheduled to run twice a year. Each session focuses on one or more key concepts, with plenty of opportunities for discussion and reflection to support deeper learning.

It has been a rewarding experience planning a Lunch & Learn series to introduce Bowen theory. It is my goal to make Bowen theory more accessible, and I will continue to think through and explore different ways to present these important and nuanced concepts in a clear and engaging way.



ELEVATOR SYSTEMS PODCAST

In August, 2024, Living Systems premiered a podcast called Elevator Systems that works to present Bowen theory clearly, understandably, and with examples that relate to everyday life. Dixie Vandersluys came up with the idea of using an elevator pitch as a starting point for discussion on ideas and concepts of theory and Katie White agreed to co-host.

Over the past eight months, 2 seasons and 22 episodes of Elevator Systems have been produced. Dixie and Katie are just about to record Season 3 where guests will be discussing how Bowen theory is useful in thinking about relationships across the lifespan. The response to the podcast has been positive, with people listening in at least 8 countries.

Dixie would like to thank Katie for her time and support of the project, Dave Galloway for his technical help, Maybo Lui for promoting the podcast on social media, Dixie's son Luke for creating the intro/outro, and the guests who have decided to try out a "ride in the elevator."

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

The conference committee has been busy this year planning two conferences. On March 7, 2025, we held an online conference, "The Hidden Patterns of Relationships: Clinical Applications of Family Systems Theory" with keynote speaker Dr. Kathleen Smith and other papers presented by Living Systems speakers Katie White, MA and Dr. Bruce Hiebert. 78 people registered for the conference and reviews had lots of positive feedback.

On October 17-18, 2025, Living Systems is offering a hybrid conference at the University Golf Club on "Aging: Individual Challenge or Family Opportunity?" Amie Post, MA will be the Bowen theory keynote speaker and two local scientists will also be keynote presenters, Dr. Annalijn Conklin from UBC and Dr. Theresa Pauly from SFU. The afternoons will have speakers and interviews with colleagues and faculty from Living Systems about specific areas of aging. We hope it will be a timely and informative conference.

In 2027 Living Systems will be hosting the 5th International Conference on Bowen Theory. A separate committee is being set up for this, and we are looking for volunteers! Please reach out to Katie White or Dixie Vandersluys if you are interested in being a part of this effort.

Finally, thank you to all of the members of the conference committee: Katie White, Leila Howard, Maybo Lui, Dave Galloway, Yvonne McKenna, Corrie Howard, and Denise Kwan (plus Mark Smith for the October conference). We each have our part and I'm pleased with how smoothly and efficiently we accomplish our goals!





NEW WEBSITE

Last November, the website went live after a complete revision of the site. This allowed us to implement several important features. One is a new look and feel this is also easy to maintain. We can now more effectively feature items on our home page. It also creates a more consistent brand image across the site. The upgrade provided usability features that have been almost mandatory, like cookie management and disability choices for users. This laid the foundations for ongoing, page by page, enhancements to improve our readability and SEO results.

The blog post and podcast series add several hundred page views per month. These items provide content for our social media presence, which creates traffic to our site. Both the blog and podcast are important ways that the public hears about Living Systems and Bowen Theory.

Living Systems had a net profit of approximately \$5,782 for our March 31st, 2025, year-end financials. This profit is largely attributed to the net income from our April 17, 2024 and March 7, 2025 conference. This profit will be transferred to the conference fund on our balance sheet and will be utilized to support future conferences.





2024-2025 FINANCIALS YEAR ENDING MARCH 31, 2025


Total Revenue: \$286,992
